Course Title	Course Description Summary
Introduction to Constitutional Law	Covers the structure and interaction of the three branches of government under the 1987 Constitution, including key Supreme Court decisions and current political contexts.
Introduction to Labor Laws and Social Legislation	Introduces labor law through three modules: labor standards, labor relations, and enforcement procedures and administrative mechanisms.
Introduction to Criminal Law	Discusses criminal law principles, stages of felonies, liabilities, penalties, and rights of the accused. Traces the criminal case process and uses real Supreme Court cases.
Introduction to Family Laws	Focuses on marriage, annulment, legal separation, property relations, parental authority, and other family-related legal matters under the Family Code and related laws.
Introduction to Intellectual Property Law	Introduces intellectual property concepts such as copyrights, trademarks, patents, and trade secrets, and highlights their legal and strategic importance.
Introduction to Civil Procedure	Explains basic civil procedure including jurisdiction, venue, pleadings, motions, and appeals, along with recent updates in procedural rules.
Introduction to Public International Law	Covers international law principles, statehood, UN structure, state rights and responsibilities, diplomacy, and dispute resolution, with application to global issues.
Introduction to Human Rights Law	An elective that focuses on human rights protection and advocacy in the Philippines, including policy recommendation development for legislative and executive bodies.
Introduction to Environmental Law	Studies constitutional and special laws on natural resource use and environmental protection, including key international agreements like the Paris Accord and Kyoto Protocol.
